



 (case of the Belgrade-Budapest railway)










II. Opportunities offered by the BRI

 - case of the China Indochina Corridor




FDI in Pakistan (2016-2017)

a Chinese perspective

China: a global power: More interventionism in world affairs: (Afghanistan, Pakistan, Myanmar...) The BRI a global project Transparency and business ethics (public bids and tenders, state companies) (but also an opportunity to reform China's economy)



a European perspective

- Supporting free-trade:
 populist protectionism on the rise
 Free trade agreements hard to reach (US, Canada...)
- Supporting the EU team
 Fighting against competition,
 no duplication among EU members




Competition in the Mediterranean sea
